

**UCD Ad Astra Academy Dolphin Bursary
Terms and Conditions:**

The recipient of this bursary must be in receipt of an Ad Astra Academy Scholarship in the year that the Ad Astra Scholarship is first awarded and they must meet progression requirements of their programme.

If during the period of the bursary, candidates receive funding from other and/or additional sources, the candidates must disclose this to the Ad Astra Academy at the earliest opportunity. The Academy may adjust the bursary where this arises.

Bursaries are awarded on a one-off basis and cannot be deferred.

Bursary recipients must be registered to a Level 8 or above UCD programme of study whose structure has a minimum of 50 credits per academic year.

Bursary recipients must provide a short report on how they used their funding supported by philanthropic donors, including a statement on the benefits/learning experienced in pursuing the relevant opportunity.

UCD Ad Astra Academy reserves the right to withdraw or suspend the bursary if the student faces disciplinary proceedings within UCD.

The bursary will be discontinued if a scholar withdraws from the University.

The bursary will be discontinued when a scholar has failed to pass their probation period of their Ad Astra Academy Elite Sports scholarship.

The bursary will be discontinued when a scholar is found to be in breach of the Student Code.

The bursary will be discontinued when a scholar is found to be in breach of the General and/or Specific Ad Astra Academy Terms and Conditions.

The award of bursaries is entirely at the discretion of the awarding committee whose decision is final.

Applicants will be notified of the outcome of their application by UCD Ad Astra Academy, via the UCD connect email, by no later than 31st October 2023.

UCD Ad Astra Academy will not enter into further correspondence with unsuccessful applicants.
