



MA or GradDip in TESOL (Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages)

(One Year Full Time or Two Years Part Time)



Introduction

The programmes are aimed at both experienced TESOL teachers and graduates who aspire to become English language teachers but hove no professional teaching experience. Through the programmes students will develop best practice through engagement with state-of-the art research and acquire a familiarity with technological advances. The TESOL team are classroombased language practitioners who underpin their work with the most cutting-edge

pedagogical research and advances in technology. The programmes emphasise the importance of research-informed practice, critical reflection, autonomous learning and the translation of theory into practice.

Our TESOL team will also foster collaboration with local and international experts in the field to ensure that students can network, share best practices and contribute to the growing professionalisation of the TESOL field.

Course Highlight

Students on the TESOL programmes will explore the theoretical underpinnings of English language teaching and will link them directly to their experience in the classroom. Each week, research will be brought to the practical setting of the classroom context as students develop their knowledge and reflect on good practice.

Applicant Profile

- Applicants must hold an honours undergraduate degree (NFQ level 8) or equivalent, having normally reached a 2H1 or better. Applications with a 2H2 average are considered on a case-by-case basis.
- We welcome applicants with no teaching experience as well as more experienced teachers.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must also demonstrate English language proficiency of IELTS 7.0 (with no band less than 6.5) or equivalent.
- Applicants who do not meet the language requirements for direct entry can apply for our Pre-Sessional EAP Programme at a 50% discount.
