University College Dublin (UCD) is one of Europe's leading research-intensive universities where undergraduate education, graduate masters and PhD training, research, innovation and community engagement form a dynamic continuum of activity.

The University was established in 1854 by St John Henry Newman, whose classic work 'The Idea of a University' is one of the most enduring texts on the value of higher education. His vision, 'True enlargement of mind', embodies the aspiration to provide a holistic experience and inspiring environment beyond the classroom. It is a rallying call for the University and its community to unleash the unique potential of the individual to meet global challenges and "to benefit the wider world".

Today UCD is Ireland's largest university with over 39,000 students. Irish school-leavers benefit from the highly innovative and flexible UCD Horizons undergraduate curriculum. As Ireland's leader in graduate education UCD has almost 12,000 graduate students.

In Ireland, UCD is home to over 11,000 international students and delivers programmes to over 5,000 students on overseas campuses. In addition, the University places great emphasis on the internationalisation of the Irish student experience – preparing all UCD students for future employment and life that crosses borders, boundaries, and cultures.

Originally known as the Catholic University of Ireland, the University became UCD in 1908 and is a constituent college of the National University of Ireland (NUI). In 1997, UCD became an autonomous university within the loose federal structure of the NUI, and UCD students are awarded degrees from the National University of Ireland.

UCD has been a major contributor to the making of modern Ireland. Many UCD students and staff participated in the struggle for Irish independence and the University has produced four Irish Presidents and five Taoisigh. Among UCD's well-known alumni are authors (Maeve Binchy, Roddy Doyle, Emma Donoghue, Flann O'Brien), former European Commissioner (Peter Sutherland SC), directors (Neil Jordan, Jim Sheridan) and sports stars (Brian O'Driscoll, Kevin Moran, Rena Buckley and Paul O'Donovan). Perhaps the best known of all is the writer James Joyce, who completed his Bachelor of Arts at the University in 1902.

Sweeney, Michael Paul

Paul Sweeney is one of Ireland's most influential and collaborative economists, known for his unique contribution to the country's economic development

through the Social Partnership model. He studied both first year medicine and first year dentistry at UCD before pursuing economics at Trinity College Dublin as a mature student.

He is the former Chief Economist of the Irish Congress of Trade Unions, recognised for his distinctive and pivotal role in shaping the economic model that underpinned Ireland's modernisation. A celebrated economist and public servant, he brought his expertise to bear through membership of various key bodies, including the National Competitiveness Council of Ireland, the National Statistics Board, and the ESB.

He is a former President of the Statistical and Social Inquiry Society of Ireland. A widely published author, his published works span almost four decades, includes five books and dozens of articles on the Irish economy and public enterprise, reflecting his extensive experience and scholarly approach to economic science, including the influential book The Celtic Tiger: Ireland's Economic Miracle Explained. He has collaborated with economists from UCD and across Ireland, co-authoring papers and participating in shared events.
