



Should I buy a new laptop? No Yet!

If you have an existing laptop or can use an existing laptop for a minimum of 30 hours per week it will probably be fine for the modules in Stage 1. Start using what you have and upgrade later if necessary, that way you have a better laptop later in the programme, when you need it most.

The software you will use is available free online or through UCD and consists of:

- Excel/Word MS Office (Available through UCD Connect)
- Antivirus (Available through UCD Connect)
- Python/Matlab (Available through UCD Connect)
- Video Conferencing software e.g. Zoom (Available online)
- Web Browser e.g. Chrome (Available online)

It is recommended that your laptop has:

Camera, Microphone, WiFi, Speakers/headphone connectivity

Can I use a tablet? No, not as your primary IT device. It will take longer to carry out assignments using a tablet.


Extenuating Circumstances

Requirements for Engineering Stage 1

- Complete Stage 1 with a minimum GPA of 3.00
- Earn 30 credits in Autumn Trimester of Stage 2 with minimum GPA of 3.00
- No grade less than C- in any core module over those three Trimesters
- All Trimesters matter





