Welcome to the College of Engineering and Architecture and to your studies at UCD.

As you journey towards your future, we hope that your time in our College will be an enjoyable and enriching one for you, not only in the area of your academic achievement but equally in the area of your personal development.

We hope you make lifelong UCD friends as well by engaging with the UCD Community.

The College Office Team looks after the Student and Academic Support Services for all the **UNDERGRADUATE AND TAUGHT GRADUATE** students in Architecture, Landscape Architecture, Engineering, Planning and Environmental Policy.

Important to remember:

The College of Engineering and Architecture Office is your first point of contact for anything to do with your programme of study at UCD. And we're there to support you throughout your time at UCD.

Where we are located:

UCD Engineering & Materials Science Centre, Room 122.

The quickest way to get your query answered is via our College Office online **Student Connector**.

Queries received via our <u>Student Connector</u> are continually monitored and normally, we aim to respond to all queries within one working day, but during peak periods (like now, during registration), it may take a little longer.

Also, important to remember:

UCD Connect:

UCD Connect is where you can access your day-to-day UCD applications, such as your email, calendar, Google Drive, Brightspace, Zoom and InfoHub

Your UCD Connect email is the primary channel for official UCD communications. You will have received information regarding your email account when offered your place in UCD. It is the responsibility of each student to regularly check their UCD Connect email account.

In email communications with UCD Staff, always include your student ID otherwise it can delay your query!

In respect of the 2025/2026 academic year: Opening Hours:

The College Office opening hours are as follows:

Monday to Friday, 10am to 1pm and from 1.30pm until 4pm.

We offer a 'drop-in service' for student enquiries and can deal with basic queries at our reception desk.

However, if you require a meeting with a member of our team, we will facilitate one-to-one meetings on an appointment only basis and we are also happy to arrange meetings online via Zoom.

You can request a meeting through our <u>Student Connector</u>. Our general office hours for email contact are

8.30am - 4.30pm, Monday to Friday.

How we can help you:

- Programme and module registration queries
- Pastoral support and advice to students in relation to all aspects of University Life;
 signposting to other UCD services
- Help and academic advice
- Extenuating circumstances/Recognition of prior learning/ Workload issues/Leave of absence/Withdrawal/
- Internships
- Who we work with etc?

Your programme will also be aligned with one of our six <u>Schools</u>, so your **School Office** will be another point of contact for you, along with your <u>Programme Director</u>.

We interact with many **different units across the University** on your behalf, such as:

Student Advisers, UCD Registry – Student Records, Assessments, Admissions, Conferring Unit, UCD Global and the UCD Careers Network

As you've already heard, there's lots of new words in use "UCD – Speak" or Jargon that you'll become familiar with over the next while- courses, modules, crns etc.!

We even have a **Jargon Buster!**

For instance, your **course** at UCD will now be known as a **Programme**.

And what is a Programme?

According to UCD's Academic Regulations, A programme is an approved course of study, the successful completion of which leads to a **University award**. The award is conferred when the programme outcomes have been appropriately demonstrated by accumulating the required number of credits at appropriate levels over an appropriate period of time and all other programme requirements have been met.

Dignity and Respect

A positive working and learning environment in which everyone is valued

An environment which is free from discrimination, harassment, intimidation or bullying

Bullying Behaviour & Harassment

- Verbal abuse/insults
- Physical abuse
- Intrusion -pestering, spying or stalking
- Exclusion
- Intimidation
- Aggression
- Humiliation

- Any form of unwanted conduct of a sexual nature, verbal, non-verbal, physical
- Violating a person's dignity
- Creating a hostile, degrading, or offensive environment
- Discrimination

Informal Procedure Options

- Seek Advice and Support
 - Head of School/Associate Dean/Programme Coordinator
 - Student Adviser or Chaplain
 - Student Union Welfare Officer
 - Student Counsellors and Student Health Centre
 - Dignity and Respect Support Colleagues
 - Facilitative role
 - Specially trained to advise on options available under the policy
 - Provide Information on formal complaints process

Informal Procedure Options

- IF POSSIBLE Approach the person causing offence
- Contact the Equality, Diversity & Inclusion
 Representative For guidance about supports and procedures
- If these actions do not succeed or the case cannot be treated informally – Formal Complaint




