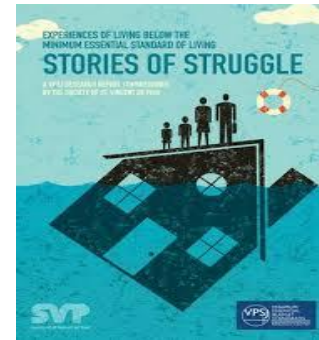

- Campaigns

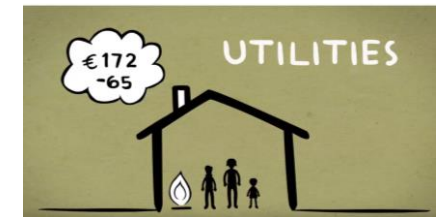


Parents struggling to make ends meet regularly go without food

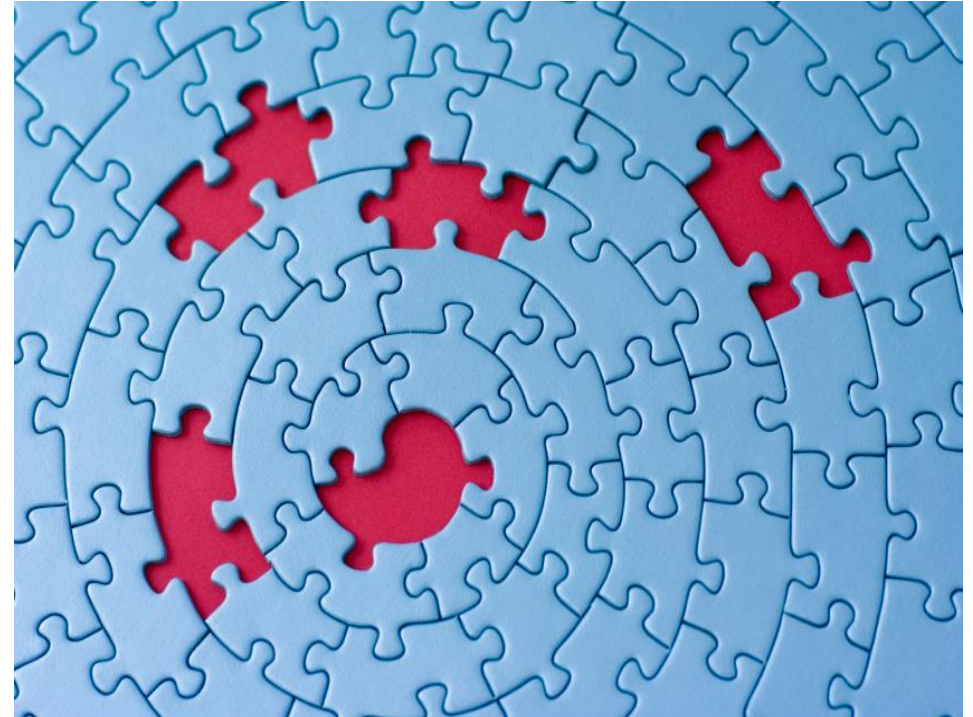

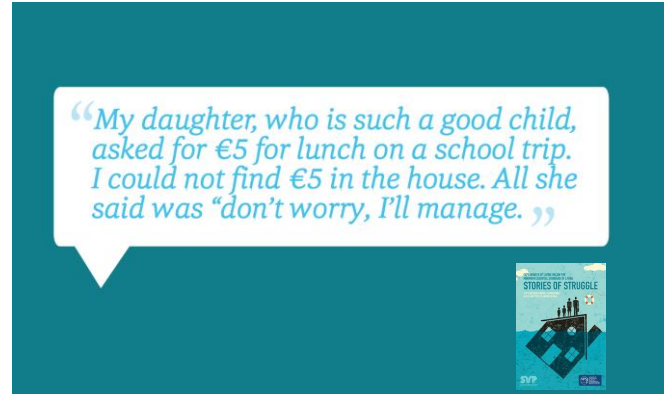
Challenge 1: Making a joined up approach to policy implementation work

- Social protection system does most of the heavy lifting: social transfers reduce poverty risk from 42.8% to 15.7%.
- But lack of investment in key services, in particular housing, health and childcare limits people's ability to get out and stay out of poverty
- Poverty is a multi-dimensional issue requiring a whole of government approach.
- Difficulties working horizontally in a vertical system.
- Constant struggle to balance short-term pressures with long term goals.
- Much more research needed on the policy implementation process in Ireland, particularly whole of government approaches.



Challenge 2: Building public support for action

- Need to create better understandings of poverty among the public and build support for action: stereotypes and stigma persist.
- Irish Times No Child 2020: conversation on the causes of child poverty and what it will take to end it.
- Commissioned research on public attitudes to poverty (Children's Right Alliance) & the economic costs of poverty (SVP & UCD).
