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PART 1 INTRODUCTION

- 1. A large-scale national Household Budget Survey was conducted between February 2015 and February 2016. A total of 6,839 sample households co-operated. .
- 2. All details keyed from completed household returns are held on a master file. Household tables are produced from a specially reformatted file.
- 3. Two types of variables are distinguished on the reformatted household tape, namely Headers (VARxxx) and Trailers. The headers are the main descriptive variables, e.g. household composition, accommodation type and tenure, while the trailers are all monetary variables dealing with income and expenditure.
- 4. There Headers are comprised of two types, namely control variables (i.e. which contain classifying codes) and observation variables (i.e. which contain quantitative information).
- 5. There are 584 Trailer variables containing quantitative average weekly income and expenditure.
