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# 2 Introduction and Study Design

The general proposal for the study was explained in "Puzzles and priorities for an Irish election study" in *Irish Political Studies*, Vol 16, 2001, pp. 161-78.

A sample of 2663 people of voting age from across the country was interviewed after the 2002 election. Households were chosen at random and then a random respondent was selected within each household. The fieldwork was carried out by the ESRI. A draft questionnaire was piloted March 2002. This is in three versions because some questions were asked of smaller sub-samples.

The actual questionnaire was fielded after the election in May 2002. There are two versions (with a short split-half) and a drop-off. The main questionnaire typically took 60 minutes to administer, and the drop-off would typically have taken a further 15 minutes. The response rate for the main questionnaire was 60 percent, with over 85 percent of those completing the supplementary drop-off questionnaire (containing, amongst other things, a module of questions from the Comparative Election Systems project (CSES)).

Following the 2002 study, respondents were sent mail questionnaires on several more occasions: in November/December 2003, in the summer of 2004 after the June 2004 local and EP elections, and in the first months of 2006. Response rates - measured against the 2002 baseline - were 45 percent, 41 percent and 40 percent respectively. In 2007, after the general election, a final wave of the study

was carried out face-to-face as in 2002. This last wave was topped up by a short mail questionnaire sent out late in 2007 to panel respondents who had not been interviewed successfully in 2007, and there were also interviews with a further 220 respondents to provide a more representative sample for 2007. The response rate for the panel element was 38 percent against a 2002 baseline, with a further 4 percent via the mail questionnaire. However, this was actually 54 percent of sought interviews completed, once deaths and changes of address without notification are taken into account. In all 518 respondents completed all five waves of the survey.

The largest wave in terms of items is the 2002 post electoral survey; the other four waves have broadly overlapping contents. Some of the questions have been included in two, three, four or all five of the interviews, thus offering opportunities for longitudinal comparison of vote behaviours and voter orientations. The five waves of interviews have been completed with the same respondents, apart from the relatively small number of new respondents were interviewed in 2007. Consequently, longitudinal comparisons can be made for aggregates as well as for individual respondents. The data is stored in both a wide and a long version to facilitate this.

## **2.1 Organisation**

The Irish Election Study 2002 was funded by a grant to TCD/UCD under the PRTL/National development Plan. The study was directed by a team led by Michael Marsh and Richard Sinnott as principal investigators, assisted by John Garry and Fiachra Kennedy who were post-doctoral students attached to the project, and a wider internal advisory group including Kenneth Benoit, John Coakley, Michael Laver, Michael Gallagher and Gail McElroy. John Curtice, Cees van der Eijk, Roger Jowell and Phil Shively attended a conference at TCD in 2001 and provided expert advice on the draft questionnaire. Later waves in 2003, 2004 and 2006 were also funded by that initial grant. An award to Michael Marsh under the IRCHSS infrastructure programme funded the 2007 study, and the consolidation of all five waves. Associate investigators were Kenneth Benoit, John Garry, Michael Laver, Michael Gallagher, Gail McElroy and Richard Sinnott. A preliminary meeting of the interested community of scholars took place in TCD in the Autumn of 2006 and financial assistance from with help from the Institute for International Integration Studies in TCD made it possible to invite several external advisors including Heinz Brandenburg, Wouter van der Brug, Ray Duch, Cees van der Eijk, David Farrell, Jeff Karp and Kathleen Knight. The final design work was done by Michael Marsh assisted by Jane Suiter and Zbyszek Zalinski.

Jane Suiter was the primary research officer for the final stage of this project, involving the 2007 questionnaire and integrating all five waves of the study; she also constructed the 2002-2007 data files. The codebook was developed by Laura Sudulich with assistance from Daniel Schultz and the web site was designed and implemented by Martin Prazak.

## **2.2 Fieldwork and Data processing**

### **2.2.1 Fieldwork and initial coding**

The fieldwork for the study and initial coding has been conducted by ESRI, Dublin. Details on sampling are provided in the section on sampling and response information "sampling information".

### 2.2.2 Cleaning and data preparation

The structure of the final datasets and the cleaning tasks were defined by Michael Marsh and Jane Suiter.

All variables names have been systemised and now have the same number across all waves. In the long dataset each variable is identified by its wave by an underscore. For example v0001\_02 refers to the whether a candidate called to the home in 2002 whereas v0001\_07 refers to the same question in 2007. In the wide dataset the wave identification variable "ines" has been included, which allows easy construction of multi-wave datasets, according to user specification.

To trace the location of each item in the original questionnaires we have included a chart showing the question number corresponding to each of the new variables in the 2002-2007 questionnaires (see p. 295). This shows us, for instance, that variable v0252 corresponds to question a12\_4 in 2002, q12c in 2003, q25c in 2004, q14f in 2006 and a10\_4 in 2007. The original questionnaires are also included here.

The variables have also been ordered into coherent blocks and the ordering of the variables has been arranged in such a way that identification of relevant information and navigation through the fields is greatly facilitated. Coding has been carried out so that where possible the same range of numerical values has been assigned to categories of different variables which have a similar meaning. In general, where question wording of coding has changed a different variable name has been used. Exceptions are indicated in the codebook along with full questionresponse wordings.

However, one major exception is vote choice. This stems from the fact that in 2002 and 2007 (reported) vote was measured using a mock ballot. While all data from these instruments is included in the data sets, a variable indicating first preference party has been constructed from the mock ballot for 2002 and 2007 and is included with vote intention responses in 2003, 2004 and 2006 as a general vote intention/report variable (v1095).

Quick reviews of the contents of the data files can be attained by scanning the VARIABLE DESCRIPTION LIST.

## 3 Variable Description List

The variable description list shows the contents of the fields of the INES 2002-2007 by listing for each variable its new name and the wording of the question. 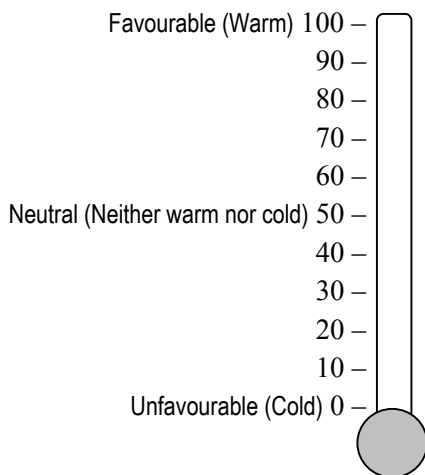

## A Election Survey2002

The Irish National Election Study (INES) 2002 is based on a survey of a representative sample of Irish people. The survey was conducted by the Economic and Social Research Institute (ESRI) after the election and was based on face-to-face interviews. Persons 18 years or older were interviewed and no regions of the country were excluded from the sample frame.

Persons residing in institutions were excluded. Military personnel were included provided they lived at a private address and were excluded if their primary address was an institution. Note that almost all military personnel in Ireland live in private households. In total, approximately 2.7 percent of the Irish population live in institutions. No other persons were excluded from the sampling frame.

A three-stage clustered sampling approach was used for sample selection. In the first instance a random sample of PSUs (Primary Sampling Units) was selected. In the second, a random sample of households was selected. In the third a random person within the household was selected. The sampling frame used was the most up to date national electoral register. Electors are recorded in the electoral list in so-called Polling Books. For sample selection purposes these polling books are reconstituted into area units known as District Electoral Divisions. There is a total of 3,400 DEDs in Ireland. These DEDs are the most spatially disaggregated area units for which census data are available and are the standard PSU building block for random sample selection. Once the Electoral Register has been re-structured into the District Electoral Division structure a random sample of 220 PSUs was selected. Each PSU was made up of the DED or aggregate thereof using a minimum population threshold criteria. A sample of 25 addresses was selected from within each of the 220 PSUs. This was the second stage of sampling. Households were randomly selected from within the PSU. Individuals were then selected from within households using the ‘next-birthday’ rule. This was the third stage of sample selection.

A sample line was designated non-sample if any of the following applied: it was a non-residential sample point; all members of the household are ineligible; the housing unit is vacant; or there was no answer at the housing unit after five call-backs. No non-sample replacement methods were used. No letter was sent to the respondent prior to the study and there were no payments or gifts used. However, as an incentive, respondents were entered into a lottery, which had eight prizes.

## **A.2 Sample weights**

The weights were constructed using a minimum information loss routine with marginal constraints based on age, gender, principal economic status, region, marital status, level of educational attainment, household size (number of persons aged 18 years and over). Because the PSUs were selected from the Electoral register larger households had a disproportionately higher probability of selection than smaller households. This was addressed in the re-weighting scheme by including a dimension on household size. This weighting scheme adjusts for both design and non-response effects. A further adjustment was made to bring the vote shares of the parties in line with recorded vote shares in the election.

Just over 150 interviewers worked on the survey. Approximately 40 percent are male. In terms of age distribution, approximately 20 percent are aged less than 30 years. A further 40 percent are aged between 31 and 40 years and the remainder are aged 51 or over. In terms of interviewer training, the following points are relevant. A pilot stage was held for the project. This involved interviewer briefing for half a day. De-briefing took place after the pilot. Interviewers were given half a day briefing for the main study. The first three completed questionnaires from each interviewer were checked immediately by data coding staff with detailed written comments sent back to the interviewer. Re-briefing of selected interviewers was carried out where necessary.

## **A.3 When were the interviews completed?**

Because these were face-to-face with individuals in designated households these could not be completed within a few weeks. However, interviews started a few days after the election and 20 percent were completed within the first month, and two-thirds within two months, 90 percent were completed within two and a half months and almost every interview was carried out within 4 months. The fact that interviewing was done over so many weeks obviously gives rise to concerns that there may be biases in the responses associated with the time of the interviews. Accordingly, some simple checks were carried out. Public support for Fianna Fáil and satisfaction with the government had declined very sharply by the time that the first post election poll was published in late September (Irish Times, 28 September, 2002). It was seen as a result of severe cutbacks in government spending after the election. This might well mean that fewer Fianna Fáil voters would have admitted their support for the party as it became clear there was no money left in the government's coffers. However, there is no significant relationship in our data between the timing of the interview and support for Fianna Fáil. Nor do we find any link between voting and the timing of interviews, using either the report of voting or the validated voting measure.

## **A.4 How long did each survey take to complete?**

On average each survey took an hour to complete. Half of the surveys were completed between 54 and 106 minutes. One quarter took less than 54 minutes and one quarter took more than 106 minutes with five percent taking less than 25 minutes another 5 percent taking more than 1 hour 35 minutes.

## **A.5 Reported turnout**

In the 2002 Irish National Election Study, 76 percent of respondents report that they voted. However, the official level of electoral participation is 63 percent. Ireland is not unique, as over-reporting of participation is common in many countries. On average, reported turnout exceeds official turnout by

26 percentage points in the British general elections, 40 percentage points in the American presidential elections, 42 percent in New Zealand general elections (Karp and Brockington, 2005)

The most common explanation for over-reporting is that some people give a socially desirable answer in order to cast themselves in a positive light. That is, people regard voting as a right and a responsibility of citizens and are reluctant to admit to an interviewer that they did not carry out this duty. That said, over-reporting may also be due to a sampling bias: people who do vote are more willing to participate in election studies than those who do not vote.

We established the degree of over-reporting by comparing a respondent's reported turnout against the official registers of electors. In Ireland, the official marked registers of electors are available for inspection up to six-months after an election. Of the 2663 respondents, 60 percent correctly reported that they voted and 21 percent correctly reported that they did not vote. A very small percentage of respondents, 2 percent, voted even though they reported that they did not vote. Comparing reported turnout with the official records allows us to identify the 17 percent of respondents who did not vote yet reported to the INES that they did vote.

It should be noted that the sampling procedure (by household) meant that when two members of a household share the same name it was not possible to identify the respondent. For example, the voting register may indicate that two individuals named Patricia Murphy live in the same household. One of these may have participated in the INES and one may have voted. Since it is not possible to distinguish between these two individuals, we code the respondent as having voted.

We found that over reporting was close to random in terms of demographic and political features

## B Election Survey Follow-Up 2003

### B.1 Data Collection

The Election Follow-Up Survey was conducted by post in 2003, one year after the original sample had completed a detailed personal interview regarding the 2002 General Election. All of the 2663 participants in the 2002 survey were contacted by post, and asked to complete a four page questionnaire. A reply-paid envelope was provided. A total of 4 mail shots were issued to respondents - the original plus 3 follow-ups. Table 1 provides an overview of the outcome of the follow-up survey. As well as the substantive content, the self-completion questionnaire collected information on the respondent's date of birth and sex to check that the correct household member completed the follow-up questionnaire. The importance of this was emphasised in the letter accompanying the questionnaire. Nevertheless, checks revealed that 112 of the completed questionnaires were clearly completed by a different person. In about one third of these cases, a comparison of the dates of birth suggested that the questionnaire might have been completed by a parent or child or the original respondent, possibly with the same name. This, unfortunately, is a common phenomenon in surveys of this nature where a postal follow-up is carried out of an original face-to-face survey. The follow-up yielded almost 1,200 cases where the original sample member completed and returned the questionnaire, representing 45 per cent of the original sample. This percentage is high for postal surveys of the general population, perhaps reflecting the greater interest in the topic due to having participated in the original in-person interview. We have no information on the reason for non-response for the majority of non-respondents (1249, or 47 per cent of the original sample). Four per cent were completed but not usable because the questionnaire appeared to have been completed by a different person. The number of explicit refusals was small (only 13 cases). A further 3 per cent were returned by An Post because the named person had moved leaving no forwarding address. A small number (6 cases) were returned marked "Deceased".

### B.2 Representativeness and Sample Weights

Table 550 shows how the sample completing the follow-up survey compares to the original sample along a number of selected dimensions. The figures in the table are weighted using the weights developed for the original sample. No adjustment is made in Table 2 for any lack of representativeness in the follow-up sample. In general, the follow-up sample is very close to the original survey sample in terms of the distribution of characteristics. Those living alone, females age 25-34, single women under age 30, women engaged in home duties, women with lower levels of education and Fianna

Fail supporters were less likely than average to return the follow-up questionnaire. However, the difference between the original sample and the completed sample amounted to only 2-3 percentage points. Nonetheless, the sample was reweighted to adjust for the difference between the original and follow-up samples. The weight from the original sample was carried to the follow-up sample. Using Gross programme, this weight was adjusted to match the population distribution using the following as control totals:

- Household size (1 to 5+ adults)
- Age by sex (9 age groups for each sex)
- Age by sex by marital status (single under 30, single 30+, married under 44, married 45 to 64, married 65+, widowed, divorced/separated).
- Economic status by sex (at work, unemployed, home duties, student, retired, other)
- Education by sex (primary, lower secondary, upper secondary and pre-degree, degree and higher)
- Region (8 regional authority areas)
- Party preference (first preference among voters).

To avoid extreme weights, the resulting weight was truncated so as to range from 1/8 of the average weight to 8 times the average weight. The match between the population and sample characteristics was only marginally affected by this truncation. The correlation between the weight for the follow-up sample and the weight for the original sample was .891.

## C Sample 2004

The Election Follow-Up Survey conducted by post in 2004, was the second postal follow-up of the original sample of persons who completed a detailed personal interview regarding the 2002 General Election. All of the 2663 participants in the 2002 survey were contacted by post in 2004, and asked to complete a four-page questionnaire. A reply-paid envelope was provided. A total of 4 mail shots were issued to respondents. Table 2 provides an overview of the outcome of the follow-up survey.

In about one third of these cases, a comparison of the dates of birth suggested that the questionnaire might have been completed by a parent or child or the original respondent, possibly with the same name. The follow-up yielded 1,102 cases where the original sample member completed and returned the questionnaire, representing 41 per cent of the original sample. This compares with a figure of 45 per cent achieved in the 2003 follow-up of the same sample. As with the 2003 follow-up, we have no information on the reason for non-response for the majority of non-respondents (1,251, or 47 per cent of the original sample). Four per cent were completed but not usable because the questionnaire appeared to have been completed by a different person. The number of explicit refusals was small (only 47 cases). A further 5 per cent were returned by An Post because the named person had moved leaving no forwarding address. A small number (14 cases) were returned marked "Deceased". Representativeness and Sample Weights

In general, the follow-up sample is very close to the original survey sample in terms of the distribution of characteristics. Those living alone, young and single adults, women with lower levels of education and those who voted for independent candidates were somewhat less likely than average to return the follow-up questionnaire. People living in two-adult households had a higher response rate than average. However, the difference between the original sample and the completed sample amounted to, at most, only 2-4 percentage points. Nonetheless, the sample was reweighted to adjust for the difference between the original and follow-up samples. The weight from the original sample was carried to the follow-up sample. Using Gross programme, this weight was adjusted to match the 2002 population using the following as control totals:

- Household size (1 to 5+ adults)
- Age by sex (9 age groups for each sex)
- Age by sex by marital status (single under 30, single 30+, married under 44, married 45 to 64, married 65+, widowed, divorced/separated).
- Economic status by sex (at work, unemployed, home duties, student, retired, other)
- Education by sex (primary, lower secondary, upper secondary and pre-degree, degree and higher)
- Region (8 regional authority areas)

- Party preference (first preference among voters).

To avoid extreme weights, the resulting weight was truncated so as to range from 1/10 of the average weight to 10 times the average weight. The match between the population and sample characteristics was only marginally affected by this truncation. The correlation between the weight for the follow-up sample and the weight for the original sample was 0.88.

In general, the follow-up sample is very close to the original survey sample in terms of the distribution of characteristics. People living in two and three-adult households had a higher response rate than average, as did those who voted FF in 2002 and married men 45-64. However, the difference between the original sample and the completed sample was typically less than 4 percentage points, the major exception being single young people (-7). The sample was reweighted to adjust for the difference between the original and follow-up samples. The weight from the original sample was carried to the follow-up sample. Using Gross programme, this weight was adjusted to match the population distribution using the following as control totals:

- Household size (1 to 5+ adults)
- Age by sex (9 age groups for each sex)
- Age by sex by marital status (single under 30, single 30+, married under 44, married 45 to 64, married 65+, widowed, divorced/separated).
- Economic status by sex (at work, unemployed, home duties, student, retired, other)
- Education by sex (primary, lower secondary, upper secondary and pre-degree, degree and higher)
- Region (8 regional authority areas)
- Party preference (first preference among voters).

For the 2007 survey, 2135 respondents who had responded in 2002 were selected (excluding only those who had died or who had moved in the intervening years and no follow-up address was available). Interviews were obtained with 1013 people. A short mail questionnaire was sent to non-respondents and this succeeded in getting 130 replies. 43 percent of interviews were completed by the end of June, a month after the election, with 88 percent completed by the end of July and 95 percent by the end of August.

In addition, a supplementary three-stage sample was selected from the GeoDirectory (a national listing of all addresses). At the first stage, addresses were clustered by electoral division, with EDs aggregated to give a minimum population of 1,000 addresses. One cluster was selected at random within each of 39 Constituencies. At the second stage, addresses were selected at random from each cluster (total of 630 addresses). At the third stage, a respondent was selected within the household so as to over-represent adults who would not be included in the follow-up sample. The rule was as follows:

- If the household contains one or more person age 18-23 who is registered to vote, use the next birthday rule to select the respondent from this group.
- If the household contains no adult age 18 to 23, select the respondent with the next birthday from this group (must be eligible to vote in national election).

If the household contains one or more person age 18-23 who is registered to vote, use the next birthday rule to select the respondent from this group. If the household contains no adult age 18 to 23, select the respondent with the next birthday from this group (must be eligible to vote in national election). From there 283 interviews were obtained. Nine responses to the mail questionnaire were received from other than the target respondents and these are also included.

The PSUs were Electoral Divisions (ED) or aggregates of electoral divisions. EDs were aggregated so that each PSU had a minimum size of 1,000 electors (2002) or 1,000 addresses (2007). PSUs were selected using a systematic sample, having sorted by area and characteristics of area (socio-economic

status, urban-rural location), with a random start. The sort means that an element of stratification is incorporated. There are two sets of weight variables for 2007, one looking back to the 2002 sample and a second providing a representative cross section in 2007. For the follow-up (panel) sample, the weight from 2002 was carried forward to the 2007 sample. The resulting sample was then calibrated to population totals from 2002 using a minimum distance algorithm (Gross, developed by Johanna Gomulka).

For the 2007 cross-sectional sample, a design weight was first applied (based on number of adults age 18 and over in the household) to the supplementary sample, the 2002 weight was carried forward for the panel sample, and the weighted (by design weight/2002 weight) sample totals were calibrated to the population totals using the Gross minimum distance algorithm. These population totals are from the 2006 Census and the Quarterly National Household Survey in terms of household size (number of adults age 18 and over), age, sex, education, economic status, marital status and region.
