Entry Requirements

- This programme is intended for applicants who hold an appropriate primary degree, with an upper second class honours or international equivalent required.
- Pre-Requisites for programme are: Clinical Human Anatomy, Applied Human Anatomy, Human Physiology, Exercise Science, Applied Physics, Chemistry-Biochemistry, Applied Human Biomechanics, Behavioural Sciences, Research Methods and Statistics.
- Motivation and interest must be demonstrated through providing a CV and a personal statement outlining motivation to study.
 Letters of reference will also be sought.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must also demonstrate English language proficiency of IELTS 6.5 (no band less than 6.0 in each element), or equivalent.
