Paper based on preliminary findings from Academy of Finland *The Frontier of Sustainability Transition (2016-2019)* research project: Paper suggests that pro-environmental strategies are mostly more rationally motivated than their counter-arguments but lack cultural sensitivity. The claim is based on 3 pending sub-studies which: 1. Compare farmers' perceptions of 'organic farming' in remote areas of Italy and Finland; 2. Analyse the politicization of the waste water management reform for sparsely populated areas in Finland and, 3. Examine the adoption of 'green urban norms' and countermovements in the suburban city through cycling culture. Lack of cultural analyses ends up overshadowing deeper social divisions behind pro-environmental and anti-ecological assemblies
