Conferring Overview.

Hi, my name is Simran. I'm a second year biomedical science student. Today I'm going to give you a quick overview of graduation also known as conferring. You can find all the links mentioned in this video on the <u>UCD current students website</u>.

<u>UCD conferring ceremonies</u> are held three times a year; June, September and December.

After passing all your exams and any course requirements, you will be conferred at the next relevant ceremony for your class.

Most undergraduate degree students that receive their final results between May and July will graduate during the September ceremonies.

Most graduate taught masters students that receive their final results between August and November will graduate during the December ceremonies.

PhD students and Research Masters students conferring ceremonies will depend on when they have submitted their hardbound thesis.

All certificate and diploma students are conferred at different times of the year in absentia. If your cohort is going to be presented at a later conferring ceremony, you will receive an invitation email closer to the time.

Key info:

Invitations are sent out 2 to 4 weeks before the ceremony date.

If you have holds on your record this may stop you from conferring until these are resolved. Check out the <u>Holds information</u> video for more info.

You can collect 2 guest tickets on the day from the registration desk. The ceremony lasts about 90 minutes.
