Overview of Module Credits & Progression.

Hi, my name is Ella and I work at the Student Desk. Today I'm going to give you a quick overview of module credits and progression. You can find all the links mentioned in this video on the UCD current students website.

Undergraduate courses are usually 60 credits per stage. 60 credits may be made up of; core modules, option modules and elective modules. Most modules count for 5 credits.

Your course structure is available online, find it using the course search. In this example, the 4 year course is 240 credits in total. In stage one, core and option modules are 55 credits. Electives are 5 credits. This will vary by stage and by programme.

Your <u>UView page</u> in SISWeb will show you how many credits you have for your current stage and previous stages.

You can progress from one stage to the next with 10 credits total outstanding. It doesn't matter which stage those 10 credits are from. Note that other specific progression requirements may apply to your programme.
